

# Summary of eBird Data

Winter Wings Festival 2012

February 16-19

This was our fourth year recording festival observations with eBird, and it was clear we had entered a new era in birding. Hundreds of eBird checklists were submitted and shared during the festival, with many coming in through the BirdLog smartphone app from BirdsEye. Field trips and other observations during the festival in 2012 recorded a total of **122 species**, our highest species total ever. The species count and volume of data submitted has continued to grow as the festival attracts more and more top-notch birders and our terrific field trip leaders and assistants remain committed to keeping track of sightings. We're shooting for 125 species in 2013; it *can* be done!

The waterfowl and raptors for which the Basin and the festival are so famous impressed as usual, and a complete checklist of species is included below. Particularly notable species included a pair of **Trumpeter Swans** and some **Tree Swallows** on Lower Klamath National Wildlife Refuge; a pair of **Bewick's Tundra Swans** in a flooded field north of Klamath Falls; a few **Greater Scaup** picked out from among the scores of Lessers; an overwintering **Western Grebe** on Tule Lake National Wildlife Refuge; **Green Heron**, **Black Phoebe**, **Hermit Thrush**, **Varied Thrush**, **Thayer's Gull**, and **Glaucous-winged Gull** at Veteran's Park in Klamath Falls; a **Northern Goshawk** seen in Lava Beds National Monument on Thursday; **Northern Mockingbird**; **Lincoln's Sparrow**; and a pair of **Common Redpolls** at Winema Lodge near Tule Lake National Wildlife Refuge that were locally famous by the end of the weekend.
